FBC MEMORY VERSE CHALLENGE

I'm so excited to invite you to join me in memorizing Scripture in 2013! Nathan has been challenging us to commit God's word to our minds and hearts. Here's the plan:

1. Ask the Lord to give you the commitment you need to memorize His word during 2013. Pray you would desire to be transformed by the renewing of your mind and be willing to hide Scripture within your heart so you might not sin against Him.

2. Stay tuned to the FBC Facebook page. On the 1st and 15th of every month in 2013, I will post my verse on the wall. For those of you taking the challenge, you will comment underneath with the verse the Lord has laid on your heart to memorize. At the end of the year, you will know 24 new Scriptures! (If you are not on FB, no worries! This is just to help keep us accountable. See #4 below).

3. Be sure to choose verses that are relevant to your life at the time; perhaps a verse that God highlighted for you in your quiet time that morning or maybe a verse that speaks to a particular sin or need in your life. If you're having trouble selecting a verse, you can always borrow mine J

4. Tell your verse to another real live person – not just online! Nathan and I have been doing this for two years now and have so much fun reciting our verses to each other. Starting January 15, you will also need to practice your past verses, so try to find someone with whom you can review.

5. Don't give up! If you don't quite have your verse learned by the next due date, just keep working on the same one. This is not a lesson in legalism! If you come through the year with only 12 verses (one per month) or even just one new verse, you still have more of God's word committed to memory than you did at the beginning.

Let's keep one another accountable, shall we? I so hope you'll join me on this adventure. Lord Jesus, make your word living and active in us throughout 2013. We know Your word will never return to You empty! Be huge in us. ~Liz

Bright Beginnings

A Note from Pastor Nathan

"Behold, I am making all things new!" – Revelation 21:5

A new year has arrived. This might invoke all sorts of emotions in us: gratitude, relief, anxiety, sorrow, dread, anticipation, excitement, joy, or fear. Maybe for you the only thing that has changed is a number. Yet we still tend to think of life in terms of years and seasons. One period of time has passed, and another has begun.

New things aren't always welcome. There is nothing inherently good about being "new." New taxes. New illnesses. New wars. These things might be "new" but they are not good.

But new things aren't always bad. Sometimes we dread any changes because we have experienced bad changes before, or because we simply like what is comfortable and familiar. Nevertheless, if we honestly look over our lives, we see many things that were once new – and maybe scary – but eventually turned out to be beneficial.

With all of this in mind, we read our Lord's gracious promise to make all things new. How do we receive this word? When God makes all things new, He will judge all evil, save His people, and redeem His creation. As the prophets have been telling us, the result will be a new world of complete justice and peace, where the Lord is rightly revered as King. If we remain committed to wickedness, this promise is bad news. But if we repent and live by faith in Christ, the promise of "all things new" is everything we could ever hope for, and more!

The message of the Gospel is that we have the opportunity to be made new right now, even as we live in the midst of a world that has not yet been made new. If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation! The Spirit of Him who raised Christ from the dead is living in us! Outwardly, we may be wasting away, but inwardly we are being renewed day by day!

Where does the Lord want to do a new work in your life this year? Maybe it's an attitude, or a behavior, or a relationship. Perhaps He wants to address something you've been keeping from Him, or something you aren't even aware of. It could be that God is asking you to say "yes" to something you have been putting off, or "no" to something you've been clinging to. Sometimes, when God does a new work in us, it feels painful!

And yet we know that God's desire is to save us so that we might be healed and whole. We trust that if God puts His finger on something in our lives – something He desires to change – that it is in fact for our good. That does not mean that every single thing that happens to us in this fallen world is good or from God. But we do trust that anything God instigates in our lives is worth responding to with open ears and humble hearts.

God seeks to refine us so that our faith might be found genuine when our Lord Jesus Christ is revealed. Let's prayerfully seek what God might have "new" for us in 2013. When the Holy Spirit works in us, let's respond with obedience, to His glory! Not that we have already obtained all of this, but we press on. Make us new, Lord Jesus!
