

#### **Thanksgiving Challenge 2014**

The 2013 Scripture Memory is wrapping up and the 2014 Thanksgiving Challenge is beginning. This year, I (Liz) am challenging First Baptist Church to take on the discipline of giving thanks every day during 2014. The guide we will be using is called "The Joy Dare," a free resource from Ann Voskamp's blog (http://www.aholyexperience.com/). You can download your copy from Ann's blog, pick up the entire guide for the year from the library counter during December/January, or refer to the newsletter for that month's categories. Every day, the guide will give you three things within a certain category for which to give thanks. For example, "3 gifts red" or "3 gifts in Christ" or "3 hard eucharisteos" (things hard to give thanks for). You will do this exercise individually, though Nathan will use it from time to time in our Sunday morning prayer time. I encourage you to make it part of your daily prayer time, perhaps even getting a gratitude journal to write down your thanksgivings. If you do this faithfully, at the end of the year, you will have listed over 1000 gifts you are thankful for! And don't stop there. Add more than just the three a day – seek to give thanks for everything, as Ephesians 5:20 tells us. The Lord has used this to change my outlook on life, and I am praying that the Lord will do the same for FBC. Jesus, replace our entitled, complaining, discontent hearts with gratitude for the grace you give us daily. To Your great glory!



A Note from Pastor Nathan

#### Hope in a Who

Sometimes life seems to fill up with suffering. Hardships are always happening around the world, but there are seasons where the particular pain around us seems to be too much.

In our pain it is natural to ask, "Why?" Technically, we have lots of answers. We can explain why something is happening in terms of medicine, history, or physics. The Bible generally explains why suffering exists in the world and in the lives of Christians. On paper, we have answers.

But when the pain is *our* pain, or *my* pain, and when that pain is *now, present, ongoing*, very few of those answers are of much help to us. The "why" answers can never quite meet our pain or heal it.

Think about the story of Lazarus, from John 11. Here is a man Jesus loves. Jesus loves his family, too. But when our Lord hears Lazarus is sick, He waits for two days. By the time Jesus arrives, Lazarus is dead. The family is devastated. In the minds of the onlookers (and the readers), the "why" questions are raging.

As the story unfolds, Jesus Himself provides two answers that I suspect were rather unsatisfying to His listeners at the time. The first: this has happened for God's glory (11:4). The second: this has happened for your benefit, so that you might believe (11:15, 42). These are nice answers, Jesus, but our beloved Lazarus is dead. *Why?* 

If Martha's comments are any indication, these are people who believe in a resurrection of the righteous at the last day (11:24). They've read the prophets. They have future hope. But they are still bothered about "why."

*Why* didn't you come sooner? *Why* couldn't you prevent this? Those are the questions implied (11:6, 37). Maybe Jesus isn't *able* to heal Lazarus. Maybe Jesus doesn't really *care*.

Both objections are answered definitively. When Jesus sees Lazarus' dead body, he *weeps*. The Lord who *waited* when He could have intervened now *weeps* at the very tragedy He apparently could have prevented.

Stop right there: whatever suffering we are going through, Jesus is waiting with us, weeping with us! This is not a harsh master but a tenderhearted Lord who takes no delight in the pain of His people. Though it might *seem* that Jesus doesn't care, He weeps! Because He loves!

After praying, Jesus calls to the dead man, and Lazarus comes out alive! So the second objection is also answered. Jesus *does* in fact have resurrection power with which to shatter our greatest enemy at any time.

In the midst of this story of suffering and pain, with swirling questions about "why," God presents us with a Who: Jesus Christ. He is the ultimate deliverer who will save His people from all of our trials, even death (11:25-26). In the meantime He looks upon our suffering with great compassion, and weeps with us.

*The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit. A righteous man may* have many troubles, but the Lord delivers him from them all" (Psalm 34:18-19, NIV, '84).

While we wait for the promised end to all suffering, we find a Who that gives peace when the "whys" cannot. His name is Jesus. When we are filled with pain and sorrow, we find comfort in this One who weeps with us and who will deliver us. Thanks be to God!
