Special Congregational Meeting – September 9

Our Food Pantry ministry is being blessed by God beyond what we considered when the CLC was designed and constructed. As a result there are more refrigerators and freezers in the Food Pantry than planned for and the CLC HVAC system is not able to properly control the temperature to comply with Food Pantry temperature regulations. The trustees have researched the situation and considered different options and shared them with the Church Council. Based on the Trustees recommended option, a special Congregational meeting is being scheduled for 9 September immediately after the worship service. The purpose of the meeting will be to obtain congregational approval to use a maximum of \$10,000.00 out of the Contingency Fund to have a Mitsubishi air conditioning unit installed to work with the CLC #11 heat pump to properly control the temperature in the Food Pantry.
