A Note from Pastor Nathan

Recently in a Sunday sermon we talked about the joy of knowing Jesus Christ. The Galatians were putting their focus on other things and losing that sense of joy. But the essence of Christianity is to know Christ, be known by Christ, and make Christ known. And this brings us great joy.

There is a thirst among our congregation for more of Jesus Christ. I want to encourage you in this. Many of you have expressed a desire to grow deeper in your relationship with Christ. This is a wonderful thing! He is drawing us to Himself. We long for more of Jesus.

The question is, how? What does it mean to have an ongoing relationship with Jesus Christ? We use this kind of language at church, but what does it look like in everyday life? If I want a deeper relationship with Jesus but don't know where to begin, how can I get started?

I believe that among our church family we have a lot of wisdom and experience to share with one another. We have each encountered the challenges of maintaining a relationship with Christ, and we have also discovered things that are really helpful to our relationships with Christ.

Our upcoming sermon series, beginning after Easter, will focus on prayer. Prayer is obviously an essential part of our relationship with Jesus Christ. We are going to look at a number of different scripture passages that have something to do with prayer. One thing I would like to do is to incorporate ideas and insights from you about your own walk with the Lord. I am very interested in your responses to the following questions...

1. What has been the biggest challenge (or challenges) for you in maintaining a daily relationship with Jesus?

2. What has been the most helpful thing (or things) for you in keeping up that ongoing relationship with Jesus?

3. What is something special that the Lord has done in your life by means of that daily relationship?

I think we have a lot to learn from one another. Some of these answers I might share (anonymously) as part of the sermon series on prayer. Others of you I might ask to briefly share your experiences with the congregation. The goal is not to lift up any one person; rather the goal is to learn from and encourage one another in our journeys with Jesus. So please pray about it. If you feel comfortable with it, I'd be interested in hearing your reflections on the questions above. Let's get this conversation going so that we might spur one another on toward a deeper walk with Christ.
