Excerpt from Eleanor Barkley's FBC History read on Mortgage Burning Day, September 15, 1985...

Our history of our church continued, we had a lot of ministers and a lot of changeover, because we were still struggling in finances. And in 1912, we actually called our first woman pastor, a Mrs. Lesley. Talk about being ahead of time! We not only took a civil rights stand in 1894, but in 1912, before the equal rights amendment was even thought about, we had a woman pastor. She was allowed to preach and she was allowed to receive new members into the church, but she was not allowed to baptize. And maybe one of the reasons for that is because at that time there was no baptistery in the church. We baptized at White River, or in White River. Now, the feeling was so strong that no one, no matter how cold it was, would catch pneumonia, or a cold, if they were baptized in the White River. And so that practice was they would go down to the river and baptize that person, when the person was brought up out of the river, they would wrap them in blankets and the rest of the congregation would stand on the banks and sing the old hymn, "Meeting at the River." Now, I know of one person in this congregation, I can see one person sitting over in one place, that was baptized in the White River. How many more were baptized in White River? Come on, raise your hands. I know Gretchen Rowe was baptized in the White River. Anybody else? ... Pearl, were you? Yes! Ok, good... Oh, there is another person... See it did happen!
