## A Note from Pastor Nathan

Others went out on the sea in ships; they were merchants on the mighty waters.

They saw the works of the Lord, his wonderful deeds in the deep.

For he spoke and stirred up a tempest that lifted high the waves.

They mounted up to the heavens and went down to the depths;

in their peril their courage melted away.

They reeled and staggered like drunken men; they were at their wits' end.

Then they cried out to the Lord in their trouble, and he brought them out of their distress.

He stilled the storm to a whisper; the waves of the sea were hushed.

They were glad when it grew calm, and he guided them to their desired haven.

Let them give thanks to the Lord for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for men.

Let them exalt him in the assembly of the people and praise him in the council of the elders.

Psalm 107:23-32 (NIV 1984)

You will keep in perfect peace
him whose mind is steadfast,
because he trusts in you.
Trust in the Lord forever, for the Lord, the Lord, is the Rock eternal.
Isaiah 26:3-4 (NIV 1984)

The first passage above is a portion of Psalm 107. A storm arises, disrupts commerce, threatens life, and brings people to "their wits' end." Literally, "all their wisdom was swallowed up." They did not know what to do. I wonder if some of you reading this, weary from the coronavirus and all of its effects, are at your wits' end. How are we going to keep on going? How long will this last? When will things be normal again? Is it ever going to end? Are we going to make it?

Usually, there is somebody we know who is facing a "wits' end" kind of situation. Often, multiple somebodies. Life on earth can be hard, and we know people going through hard things. But not all of us are enduring the same hard thing personally, and so we can be instruments of stability and hope for those who are suffering. It is easier to have perspective when you're not in the midst of the storm yourself.

In this case – our current coronavirus climate – everyone is being tested. All of society is strained. And we are plagued with questions such as those I mentioned above. The questions about *duration* might be the hardest. When we can't see the light at the end of the tunnel, or when it feels like reaching that light will take forever, our wits wear thin.

I have no idea how long the coronavirus threat will last, or how long it might take to get back to normal, or how "normal" that normal might be.

But the Lord is the Rock eternal. His love is unfailing. God has not changed and will not change. He is not at His wits' end. He has not lost money. His strength has not been zapped. He is not surprised. He is not overwhelmed. He has overcome. He promises us a future in which sorrow will be no more. He is with us always, even to the end of the age.

Anxiety is fed by the buffet of unknowns before us. Peace is sustained by the character and work of God. The steadfast mind, when confronted by the former, consistently returns to the latter. Perfect peace – "shalom-shalom," which might be translated, "peaceful peace," or, "whole wholeness" – need not wait for the difficulty to end. Perfect peace is available to all of us who resolutely look to our God in the midst of uncertain times.

Of course, complete circumstantial peace is coming. He will guide us to our desired haven. He is the Lord who stills the wind and the waves. I'm praying for you as I write this, that you will experience the calming of the storm inside of you, even as we await the calming of all storms on the outside; that we would be the people of *shalom-shalom* in the midst of a frantic world; and that His government and peace would continue to increase through us, without end.
