# A Note from Pastor Nathan

But I tell you who hear me: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you.

Luke 6:27-28 (NIV 1984)

These are among Jesus' toughest but most necessary words. We know them well. We also know how rarely and imperfectly they have been followed. Yet there is no asterisk here; no fine print; no exceptions. This is standard material for all followers of Jesus Christ.

These words have never been more appropriate than they are for us, now. Fear and hatred of the "other" is running very high in our society. There is so much animosity between various groups and persons. We humans have a hard time dealing with people who aren't like us or disagree with us.

Jesus provides the way forward. He receives all conceivable hatred toward Himself through His suffering and death on the cross. He does not fight back. He receives all. He exposes all hatred as pathetically lacking in contrast with the overwhelming power and love of God. Resurrection day vindicates Jesus' strategy.

The word of Jesus – "Father, forgive them" – becomes a word for us – "Love your enemies." And the Spirit of the One who uttered these words is dwelling in us. Word and Spirit: we have everything we need to obey.

But do we really *want* to obey? That is a good question. There is, at some level, a measure of enjoyment in speaking and thinking ill of our enemies. This is counterfeit joy but at some level we do like it.

But hatred, like all other sin, reaps death. It cannot be the way for those who are called to life in Jesus' name.

And, it is not as if our society is so short on hatred that we need to help make up for the deficit in supply.

What the world needs is the love of God. Jesus intends for us to live out His love, by means of His Spirit, to the glory of our Father. God who loves His enemies – "while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" – calls us to do the same. So, we need the Lord to change our desires, that we would desire love and not hatred.

Love is one of those things – real love, authentic, *agape* love – that can only be known, experienced. It is not demonstrated by clever argument or loud words. We can talk about love, which is good. But we must live it. And in a world where love is so very misunderstood and mischaracterized, we are called to participate in something truly revolutionary: "Love your enemies." This, when done, is noticed. This makes an impact.

Jesus says this love involves praying God's blessing on our enemies and doing good to them. This obviously starts with the people we see regularly, daily. How can we love the "enemies" we see on TV or read about on the Internet if we cannot love the "enemies" in our church, family, workplace or neighborhood? Jesus offers no exceptions. If we claim to be His, we must wrestle with Him in prayer about and on behalf of our enemies.

This is not easy. Any obedience that requires transformation of deeply held inner desires will be a lifelong journey. But I can choose to volunteer as a participant in the "on earth as it is in heaven" project. *Holy Spirit, help me, help us, to be authentic instruments of the love of God in the midst of a world that is full of hate.* 

Not that I have already obtained all of this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on...
