# A Note from Pastor Nathan

Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms... With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the saints.

Ephesians 6:11-12, 18 (NIV '84)

And what I have forgiven—if there was anything to forgive—I have forgiven in the sight of Christ for your sake, in order that Satan might not outwit us. For we are not unaware of his schemes.

2 Corinthians 2:10-11 (*NIV* '84)

Make every effort to live in peace with all men and to be holy; without holiness no one will see the Lord. See to it that no one misses the grace of God and that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many. Hebrews 12:14-15 (NIV '84)

You may have noticed that sometimes Christians disagree. Conflict itself is not a problem. Conflict handled well leads to resolution. Often the conflict contributes to a better outcome than what might have come about had the conflict never arisen. We are not called to avoid conflict.

But we are also not unaware of the devil's schemes. Our enemy prowls around like a roaring lion. But sometimes lions are loud and draw attention to themselves. So our enemy also works at times like a weed – a root of bitterness – quietly growing while we're not looking. An untended garden eventually becomes a mess.

The tendency in disagreement is to believe the other person is really the problem. Our struggle seems to be against him, against her. We begin to think that our problems would go away if that person went away. If only he/she would come to his/her senses and agree with me. Then life would be better. My problem is that person.

Scripture warns us against this dangerous thinking. The person with whom I have a disagreement is always a person created in the image of God, a person loved by God, a person for whom Christ died. Within the church, the other person is my brother or sister in Christ, also living by faith, also saved by grace. We are both part of the Kingdom of God. We are on the same team.

In the heat of the moment – or season – of conflict, we often forget this. We feel like enemies. Jesus knew this would happen. So, He calls us to pray for our enemies. If I continually pray for the person who rubs me the wrong way, it will be difficult to continue to harbor bitterness. Scripture calls us to search our hearts, to forgive one another, to be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry. All of this contributes to healthier conflict, and healthier resolution of conflict.

"I've heard all of this before," you may say. So have I. But I still need to hear it, because I still live with human beings. You, my fellow human beings, can be so annoying when you disagree with me! I can be so annoying to you when I disagree with you! Annoyance, unaddressed, grows into a bitter weed, threatening to cause division and dissention within Christ's body, the church. The attitudes of each of our hearts – yours and mine – toward one another are community issues. Therefore, we all have interest in working toward healing.

"Be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power," our Ephesians passage begins. "Keep on praying for all the saints." We need to fight against the actual enemy, and not one another. We need to prayerfully fight with God's power, not our own. For we do have an enemy, but it's not you or me. Our actual enemy loves it when we get that confused. Our struggle is not against flesh and blood...so keep praying!
