


<u>Ladies Retreat – January 24</u>

A Note from Pastor Nathan

Brothers, if someone is caught in a sin, you who are spiritual should restore him gently. But watch yourself, or you also may be tempted. Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. If anyone thinks he is something when he is nothing, he deceives himself. Each one should test his own actions. Then he can take pride in himself, without comparing himself to somebody else, for each one should carry his own load.

Galatians 6:1-5 (NIV 1984)

As we roll into December we continue to look at passages mentioned in our church's definition of membership. So far we have read Jesus' instructions in Matthew's Gospel about *what* to do when a matter of offense arises between us and another person. This excerpt from Galatians deals with *how* to go about that interaction.

Notice to whom this passage is addressed: "you who are spiritual." That adjective – spiritual – has to do with empowerment. Paul has just contrasted life "by the flesh" with life "by the Spirit." Are we working on our own strength and selfish desires, or are we operating according to the Spirit's power and guidance?

This is a good question to ask about anything in life, but it is particularly important when if we are preparing to have a conversation with someone about sin. The world does lots of confrontation, but often times that confrontation in itself is sinful: we go to put somebody in her place, to show a guy how wrong he was, to make ourselves feel better, etc. "In the flesh," it is all about power, humiliation, or revenge.

Paul calls us to go "in the Spirit" – gently, watchfully, and humbly. Each of us is subject to temptation and prone to fall. So, when we talk to our brothers or sisters about their sins, we go as those who have also and will also need those conversations about our own sins.

At this point we often take the passage in the wrong direction. "I have sinned, so who am I to talk to so-and-so about sin?" We justify saying nothing in the name of "nobody's perfect." But it is easy to use this false humility as a cover up for fear. Which of the prophets was without sin? Yet all of them were called to confront God's people about sin.

I have never particularly enjoyed it when someone has pointed out my sin. Perhaps you feel the same way. But we all have benefited from that correction. Though painful, a well-intentioned rebuke often serves to stop us from going in the wrong direction and help us to go in a better direction. We humans *need* correction. The conversation in 2 Samuel 12 was unpleasant for David, but Psalm 51 reveals how grateful he was for it.

And so this is a matter of love, especially as brothers and sisters in Christ. We are being transformed into the likeness of Christ. The intent of the "body of Christ" is that others would look at us and see Him. We need one another's accountability for this, don't we? And that accountability itself – the way it is offered – must also reflect the love of Christ.

So, let's pray for discernment and courage, that we might be willing vessels of needed accountability to one another. Let us also pray for humility and grace, that we might be vessels of love and not hate. The Lord has called us to this, so He will help us, by His Spirit.

Not that we've already obtained all of this, or have already been made perfect, but we press on to take hold of that for which Jesus Christ took hold of us.
