# A Note from Pastor Nathan

He gently leads those that have young. Isaiah 40:11

There are two prayer boxes in the CLC, one in the entryway for our preschool and daycare ministries, and another in the waiting area for our food pantry. I check weekly for requests, most of which are anonymous.

Sometimes they are funny. A little girl asked that I pray for her brother and sister because of their rudeness.

Sometimes they are heavy. Last week I found a prayer card that simply said this: Parenting is the hardest job.

Parenting is hard. There are a great number of ongoing challenges and unanticipated circumstances. Nobody has had perfect parents from which to learn, and no one has had perfect children to raise. There is no manual.

In a few weeks, I will preach on the subject of condemnation. We live in a highly critical society. There is an alarming eagerness to pass judgment on people and things. Anyone armed with a mouth, keyboard, or camera can broadcast this harshness. Even when we are right about what (or who) is wrong, we are often very wrong in the expression of our rightness.

In some cases, we experience the greatest condemnation from a parent. Maybe the parent didn't intend it or realize it. But sometimes, the harshest voice in the life of a child is a dissatisfied parent, lacking in grace. Sometimes those condemning words or glances reverberate down through the years to haunt a grown-up child.

In other cases, we experience the greatest condemnation once becoming parents. Just as people love to rip in to athletes or politicians for bad decisions or poor performances, so also we are quick to judge parents for one thing or another. Many of these judgments are not regarding matters of right and wrong, but of preference or style. If we can find an audience to agree with our assessment of someone else's parenting, we're in business.

People are quick to judge parents because people are often insecure about our own parenting. Nobody's kid turned out perfect. Nobody did a perfect job of parenting. So we are looking for validation. "I did it well, didn't I?" "My way was the right way, wasn't it?" "Look at So-and-so's kid. If only So-and-so would have parented my way. If only So-and-so were as smart as I am." "Clearly, my way of parenting was superior to theirs." "Why are they so selfish? Why don't they do things the way I think they should do them?"

I could go on, but you get the idea. If parenting is the hardest job, and if many people are carrying the baggage of our own parents' condemnations, how might we approach the upcoming holidays? What if Mother's Day and Father's Day are sources of pain for more people than we realize? What if people have lingering doubts about whether we can ever be good enough *for* Mom and Dad or good enough *as* a mom or dad?

I think this calls us first of all to compassion. The Lord has compassion on those with young. Who am I to be harsh? If the Lord has mercy on hurting parents and children, then Holy Spirit fill me also with compassion.

And secondly, we are called to pray. Pray for strength and grace for the parents that we know, to get through the coming day, the next week, the looming challenge. Pray for healing. Pray for healing between parents and children. Pray for healing in the hearts of those who may never experience healing in our human parent-child relationships but who desperately need to know in our hearts that we are beloved forever by our God.

Thirdly, consider the value of a well-placed word of encouragement. What parent or child can you bless today?
