A Note from Pastor Nathan

"...and you will be my witnesses..."

Acts 1:8

Sometimes it's helpful to take a word or phrase from Scripture and let our minds dwell on it for a while. In the midst of this call to become Jesus' Spirit-empowered messengers to the whole earth, we find the word, "be."

The word, "be," doesn't seem like such a big deal until we consider the alternative: "do." Jesus does *not* say, "You will *do* some witnessing," but rather, "You will *be* my witnesses." Obviously, there will be things to do and words to say. The focus, however, is not on task but on identity. I *am* a witness; you *are* a witness.

This raises the immediate and perhaps uncomfortable question, "What kind of witness am I being?"

What kind of witness am I being at home? To my spouse? To my children? To my grandchildren? Is there anything about my way of being which makes following Jesus more – or less – compelling to my family?

What kind of witness am I being at work? How do I interact with my co-workers? What kind of language do I use? How do I handle conflicts, pressure, deadlines? With what attitude do I treat my superiors, or those who report to me? Does my way of working reflect the demeanor of Jesus? Does my co-workers' experience of me lead them to desire more of an experience with Jesus?

What kind of witness am I being at school? How do I treat other students? How do I treat my teachers? What kind of attitude am I telegraphing? How do I treat those whom nobody else likes? Does my presence in the school building reflect the love and compassion of Jesus?

What kind of witness am I being in the community? Are my interactions in public places more pleasant for the people who work there than their interactions with non-Christians are? Am I patient? Am I kind?

What kind of witness am I being at church? How do I treat my brothers and sisters in Christ? Do I exude grace, or something else? How do I handle it when I don't get my way? How do I respond when other Christians say or do disappointing things? With what tone do I speak in conversations or in meetings?

What kind of witness am I being?

My witness and your witness has the capacity to draw people toward Jesus or to repel people away. Our ways of being have the potential to invite people into the church or to drive them away from the church. We can be the kind of people that others cannot resist, or we can be the kind of people that others cannot stand.

I left out the phrase that precedes the quote above. "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you." If we look across the Scriptures, we see that the power of the Spirit is obviously for *doing amazing work*, but it is also for *being a transformed people*. We rejoice in the power of the Spirit to change us!

"Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death" (2 Cor. 7:10, NIV '84). If we are troubled by any of our answers to the above questions, we rejoice that God does not abandon us in places of regret, but calls us forward, forgiven and whole, to walk with Jesus into something greater, better, fuller. We confess, repent, and press on.

As I write, all of this seems fitting for a church that seeks to "love our neighbors as ourselves." *Lord Jesus, help us to* be *your witnesses, faithfully and fully.*
