# A Note from Pastor Nathan

Happy New Year! I want to update you all regarding a particular prayer request for 2018.

On Saturday, January 6 (snow date: January 13), the Deacons and Church Council will gather at the church (9 a.m. to 3 p.m.) for a retreat to talk about our vision for the upcoming year and beyond.

The primary product of this retreat, I anticipate, will be questions. Rather than coming back and telling the rest of us what we have to do, this group will be asked to produce a list of questions. These questions will be questions that all of us can begin praying about — as individuals, as households, as committees — so that we might discover what the Holy Spirit has for us next. Then of course we will follow up in various ways.

There will be a theme to all of this question-asking: "Love your neighbor." We desire to love our neighbors, not just because Jesus commanded us to, but so that we might be overflows of His love to those around us. The love of Jesus and our love for Jesus compels us to love others whom Jesus loves.

"Neighbor," as I've written in this space before, must be understood broadly. A neighbor is anyone who is "next to" me or you: the next house, the next cubicle, the next locker. But neighbors must also be prayed about specifically: that person who lives next door, that coworker, that classmate, that teacher, that parent of my kid's friend, that coach, that cashier at the store. Among us, the Lord has given us many neighbors to love.

The first question-generating phase of the retreat will address the things we are already doing. What can we do as a church to love our neighbors more effectively through the ministries/programs we are currently doing? That question, and the set of questions and ideas it generates, will be very important, but we must not stop there.

This leads to the second, and I believe, more important question: What new avenues is the Lord giving us to love our neighbors? We must especially consider those opportunities which depend on us as individuals/households that cannot be "programmed." This is essentially what Jesus did for us at Christmas. He came down to us, to live among us. How might we more effectively "make our dwelling among" the neighbors around us, "full of grace and truth"?

All of this requires a third question, which is, What do we need to learn about our neighbors/neighborhood in order to more effectively love our neighbors? We need, certainly I need, to learn more not just about our people but our place. I cannot assume that I know how I can best show God's love to you. I need to get to know you. There is an increased awareness we need, of our community and its people, in order to love more effectively.

I write these things to you now so that you might join me in praying for the retreat day and for those of us who will be there. I also ask you to begin praying because I am interested in what the Holy Spirit says to all of us. If you are reading this newsletter, you are a valuable part of the FBC family and you have valuable ideas to share.

My hope is that the retreat day generates dozens of questions that we can pass along to the people and the committees of FBC. Not every question will relate to your household or to your area of ministry in the church. But I'm pretty sure that all of us will come away with questions to pray about. And, the Holy Spirit working as He does, there will be common desires and ideas that will be awakened in multiple people at the same time. And there will be sharing of stories. And the Lord will say again, "See, I am doing a new thing!" (Isa. 43:19).

Even as I write this I am so excited to serve as your pastor and to see what the Lord has on the horizon for us!
