Family Friendly Entertainment Now Available at the Church Library!



A Note from Pastor Nathan

As the New Year begins the Lord is leading me to offer some comments about issues that arose last year. You are aware of two separate incidents that occurred in Ferguson, Missouri, and Long Island, New York. Those two events have stirred emotions, opinions and responses around the country. Prayer is probably the most helpful response. Any other truly helpful responses will flow from prayer. I suggest that we pray for our nation in the following ways. These are not necessarily ordered according to importance, but each is important.

First of all, pray for those who have been victims of injustice. Some injustice is racially motivated. Some injustice has generations of unjust effects. I am not qualified to diagnose or explain the causes and effects of these injustices. But I am a human being who has experienced pain. Many have experienced far greater pain than I have. Some of that pain has been caused by racially-motivated evil. We need to pray for those who have been on the receiving end of that evil. Lord, have mercy.

Secondly, pray for those who have perpetrated injustice. If we are honest, that includes every one of us who has ever cheated or lied about anything. When we hear of someone who has done something we think is terrible, our tendency is to judge and condemn. And we might be right about how wrong they were. But all sinners, including me, need a Savior. We all need grace and healing. We need humility and repentance. So join with me in praying for those who have done evil.

Thirdly, pray for your enemies. "Enemy" must be defined broadly, according to the reaction of my heart toward a person or group. Those who irritate me, frustrate me, or do things that I believe are counterproductive, are all in the "enemy" category. Hatred and resentment of my enemies accomplishes nothing. Many of my enemies are not really enemies, if only we could have a venue for listening and understanding. But even in the cases of those who are truly my enemies, the Lord calls me to pray. How are Sauls converted to Pauls? How are Nathans full of hate converted into Nathans full of love? Prayer. Let us pray for our enemies.

Fourthly, pray for our law enforcement officials. I believe that the vast majority of law enforcement personnel are honorable people who desire to protect the public and are willing to risk their lives for that purpose. For them I am grateful. Incidents like those in Ferguson and Long Island make their jobs more dangerous, not less. While some police officers have at times acted wrongly, other officers have at times been wrongfully accused. We need to pray for these men and women who seek to uphold justice and peace in the midst of great pressure.

Fifthly, pray for the ways we handle conflict in America. We are often slow to listen, quick to speak, and quick to become angry. Our hasty anger is not producing righteousness. We cling to clichés and listen only to those who agree with us. We label and judge and accuse. We yell as if volume makes us right. We hold on to hatred and revenge. We overgeneralize. These are ancient problems, but they are in some sense heightened by the volume and speed with which our technology enables information to spread. Pray that wise words, patient ears, and tender hearts would prevail. And pray that it would begin with us.
