Congregational Meeting on August 11

There will be a vote at the next Congregational meeting to change the wording in the Personnel, Policies, and Procedures Handbook that describes the position of Director of the Bright Beginnings Daycare Ministry of the First Baptist Church Bloomfield. We will strike the phrase "This is a salaried position." Due to a change in the State's minimum requirement for salaries to qualify as exempt for overtime pay, the Director's position is now hourly. This allows us to accurately track the overtime we'll be required to pay. We will add the wording "The record of hours worked will be submitted weekly to the Bookkeeper." These changes will take place under 1.4.6 Bright Beginnings Daycare Director.

When I was hired here in 2004, I never could have imagined the things that would take place over the next 18 years. A NOTE FROM PASTOR NATHAN

One generation will commend your works to another; they will tell of your mighty acts...

They will celebrate your abundant goodness and joyfully sing of your righteousness.

Jesus calls us to love our neighbors, and that includes students! There are many young people in our community who need adults who will love, invest in, and pray for them. Since the school year is beginning soon, I thought this would be a good opportunity to lift up some youth ministries in our church and community for you to prayerfully consider.

Our local schools need our support. Children and youth need mentors, tutors, substitute teachers, and other volunteers to help in the classroom and with extracurricular programs. I have tutored a handful of students at Bloomfield High School and would be glad to talk with you about my experience. Several among us at FBC have served as substitute teachers, and I'd be happy to connect you with them. Contact Bloomfield Elementary School at 812-384-4271 or Bloomfield High School at 812-384-4550 and ask how you can help. If you live closer to WRV, Linton, Eastern, or North Daviess, I am sure there are plenty of ministry opportunities in those schools as well.

Greene County is also in need of Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA's) to provide legal advocacy for children in the DCS (Dept. of Child Services) system. Among us, Steve and Sandy Clark and Mary Puntney currently serve in CASA roles, and would be glad to speak with you about their experience. Greene County currently has 40 kids on the list who need legal advocates. Perhaps the Lord is nudging you to serve in this way.

Erin's Purpose provides a wide variety of activities and services for students. The ministry is located immediately across the street from Bloomfield High School. In addition to Bible studies, educational, mentoring, and tutoring programs, Erin's Purpose is building a facility to house students who are in the DCS system and awaiting Foster placement. Contact Terri Neighbors (812-227-1112) about getting involved with Erin's Purpose.

Open Arms Ministries provides housing for youth who are without a safe home. They have group homes for boys (Lyons) and girls (Switz City). They also seek to identify Foster and adoptive homes for these young people. You could volunteer for Open Arms in a variety of ways, meeting with students directly, volunteering to help with maintenance, donating supplies, and other ways. For more information, call 812-659-2533 (Switz City) or 812-659-2001 (Lyons).

If the Lord is calling you to Foster parenting, adoption, or providing respite care, I encourage you to talk to Braden or Tasha Hudson, who are our resident experts! I know that many of you have also rallied around the Hudson family to support them in their calling and I thank you for that. It has been said that if every church in Indiana had one Foster family, the problem of children without a home would be solved. Let's continue to support this family well!

When I was entering second grade, my dad was recruited to serve as a Cub Scout leader. At the time, the slogan was, "It's only an hour a week." This was a slight underestimate! But Dad's involvement made a difference to me and to many other boys for many years. FBC hosts meetings for Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts. If you'd like to volunteer to support Scouting, contact James Malone. (I am not sure who leads our local Girl Scout group, but if you do, please let me know.)

Of course, there are also ministries to children and youth inside the walls of our own church. Talk to Eric Moody if you'd like to help with Hoops for Him. Ask Brenda Flanagin about helping with Kingdom Kids. See Sandy Clark, Tasha Hudson, Alecia Henry, or Kathy Ham if you'd like to help with children's Sunday school. Talk to Liz or me if you'd like to help with our junior-senior high youth. We have many one-time opportunities to host students for a fun event or service project, and of course we would love to have volunteers to sustain a weekly youth program beyond Sunday mornings. Contact Tasha Hudson (Bright Beginnings Board Chair) if you'd like to volunteer to support our daycare ministry in some way, or Michelle Foxworthy (Bright Beginnings Preschool Teacher) if you'd like to help out with preschool.

I have probably left out various ministries and people. Consider this a list in progress! Please pray about how the Lord is calling you to minister to the young people of our community. We have opportunities to be a blessing in Jesus' Name.
