Through STAR Club, at-risk Middle School students have access to tutors and general academic enhancement of their reading, writing, mathematic, and science skills. STAR Club also takes the time to share resources and opportunities for recreation, moral education, spiritual growth, and personal and social skills development in children in the Saint Albans area.

The American Baptist Home Mission Societies is always eager

to support ministries that seek to expand the impact of their outreach by expanding the breadth of their services to serve more people. Because of great stories STAR Club shared after the first grant, ABHMS was able to award a follow up grant that took the growing ministry to a whole new place.

The STAR Club went outside the church and invested their time and energy into planting a community
