ECHOES FROM THE BELL TOWER

O Come All Ye Faithful (Adeste Fideles), John Francis Wade (1743)

Special Mention: Frederick Oakeley (1845)

O Come, All Ye Faithful (originally written in Latin as Adeste Fideles) is a Christmas carol which has been attributed to various authors. In 1743, John Francis Wade had produced a copy of the now popular O Come, All Ye Faithful. After his passing in 1786, English Catholics began returning to Britain, bringing the carol with them. Frederick Oakeley eventually came across this carol and was so moved that he decided to translate it into English for Margaret Street Chapel. After converting to Catholicism in 1845, Oakeley revised the original Ye Faithful, Approach Ye to the now famous O Come, All Ye Faithful, Joyful and Triumphant.



FOOD PANTRY NEWS

The food pantry served 73 families during the first of November through the

16th. The pantry was closed the week of Thanksgiving and reopened on Tuesday, November

28th. 100 families were served in the month of October. First Baptist Church hosted the Catholic

Charities district meeting in Fellowship Hall on Tuesday, November 14th and the pantry was
inspected that morning. On the whole, the pantry did relatively well during the inspection. Food
donations from the Bloomfield 5th grade will be picked up Friday, December 1st. USDA from

Catholic Charities will be picked up on Thursday, November 30th. The pantry received a check from
the Classic Cruisers organization in the amount of \$2000 which is very well received and will be
spent on different purchased items in the next few weeks.

Thank you to the First Baptist congregation for donating to White Christmas!!! A total of 75 boxes will be assembled. So far 74 families have called in to receive a box with 60 of the total individuals (217) being children. Praise God from whom all blessing flow!!!!!!

PRESCHOOL NEWS

Children have been studying Columbus, Pilgrims, Indians, leaves, sunflowers, and pumpkins. They got to make butter while talking about the Pilgrims. Pastor Nathan and John Cummings gave the children a model train demonstration and we made trains out of the letters of our names. We made Indian corn out of beads and talked about the Mayflower. We made Thankful Trees and each child said what they are thankful for. Each day before snack, we go around the table, and each child has the opportunity to pray. The children are given time to express themselves verbally as they build their vocabulary and learn to stay on topic. We review the days of the week and months of the year, in addition to numbers and letters, and learning how sounds make words. We are preparing for our

Christmas Program, which will be a <u>Nativity Scene</u> on Friday, Dec. 15th at 6:30pm in the Sanctuary. You are all welcome to attend!





BRIGHT BEGINNINGS UPDATE

The Congregation has graciously voted to monetarily support the Preschool for the 2024-2025 school year if necessary. Our enrollment was not large enough this year to sufficiently pay our teacher and assistant and cover supplies. We have the checkbook balance to be able to cover the 2023-2024 school year. Even though there is low enrollment, we need an assistant because we need there to be two adults in case of emergency situations. As a reminder, there were longstanding preschool teachers prior to 2021, so we are just building the program back up with a

new teacher. This is also our first year without the daycare, so preschool attendance is influenced by caregivers' ability to pick up / drop off children during work hours. We so appreciate Michelle Foxworthy stepping up to be the Preschool Teacher and the parents and children seem to really enjoy the preschool experience she is providing. She has been assisted by Ivy Foxworthy, and now Willow Foxworthy. We just concluded the Dillman Farms fundraiser and are pleased to have raised \$335.

4th THROUGH 6th GRADE SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS

The 4th through 6th grade Sunday school class spent the last few weeks dispelling some myths. The memory verse was from 2 Timothy 3:16 which says: "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness." These lessons provided ways to help them when they are challenged by their peers and others. The myths discussed were: 1) you are number one, 2) there's no such thing as absolute right and wrong, 3) the Bible is a myth, and 4) there are more than one way to get to heaven.

The students heard a skit each week by Tasha Hudson (Jeremy, a Christian kid) and Kathy Ham (the Liar). The Liar found Jeremy reading the Bible at the beginning of each skit and the Liar tried to convince Jeremy to believe the myths. In the end, the Liar gave up and realized there was no fooling Jeremy. And the Liar admitted that God is number one, that there is absolute right and wrong, the Bible is true, and Jesus is the only way to Heaven.

The lessons included an object lesson, a game, scripture, and craft activities which were used to dispel the myths and drive the points home. We discussed:

- that Jesus teaches us that if we want to be great, we will serve others (Mark 9:33-35)
- the Bible teaches us there is absolute truth, as well as right and wrong (2 Timothy 3)
- Biblical and archaeological evidence to back up the Bible, and that the Bible is a book rooted in real history that teaches us who we are and what God has done for us (Matthew 27:11-25)
- Jesus says He is the ONLY way to be saved (John 14:5-6)

Only by believing in Jesus can we get to Heaven. And one of the most loving things we can do is tell others that Jesus is the only Way.

FROM THE MODERATOR

Congregational Meeting Highlight Results

Twenty-eight members were present at the 9 November congregational meeting to vote on the agenda items. All items that required a vote were approved. Which included the following:

Slate of officers for 2024. Vacant positions still exist in the Assistant Moderator and Sunday school Superintendent.

A budget line was approved to be added to the 2024 budget of \$3,000 that will enable the Preschool to continue and to meet its fiscal requirements.



The 2024 budget, totaling \$280,180.89, that included the \$3K preschool budget line, a three percent raise for the Pastor and 2% raise for the bookkeeper, custodian, and the secretary. The secretary's 2% raise was approved in the form of a four-day paid annual vacation.

A special called congregational meeting will be scheduled during the first quarter of 2024 to request approval of proposed changes to the FBC Constitution and Personnel, Policies and Procedures Handbook once the council has completed their review.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR NATHAN

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.

John 1:14

Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need. Hebrews 4:16

Several years ago, we spent Advent Sundays unpacking the theology of the hymn, *What Child Is This?* The hymn writer envisions the nativity scene and asks what King Jesus is doing in such harsh and humble conditions. The answer he discovers is profound: "Good Christian, fear, for sinners here the silent Word is pleading."

Intercessory prayer works like this: somebody loves God and loves you, so that person talks to God about you, in your favor. Intercession is why Jesus came. His life and death are a plea before God on our behalf. On the cross, He made intercession for the transgressors (Isa. 53:12). He continues to intercede on our behalf at the right hand of God (Rom. 8:34). He always lives to intercede for us (Heb. 7:25). Christmas was the beginning of Christ's continual prayer for us.

Jesus' intercession on our behalf is authentic because He walked a life on earth much like ours. He pitched His tent in our neighborhood (John 1:14) as "God with us" (Matt. 1:23). He faced all of the trials and temptations we encounter, yet without sin (Heb. 4:14-15). He is the perfect combination of relatability and victory. He knows our struggles and He has overcome. Christmas launched the journey of Christ becoming our perfectly qualified and fully effective high priest (Heb. 2:17-18). There is such hope in this! The One who has overcome death itself is decidedly and actively for us in prayer.

Jesus came at Christmas to pray. Christmas, therefore, invites *us* to pray. We respond to and participate in the work of Christ by praying. We come near to Him in prayer.

Christmas paints a beautiful picture of God's desire to come near to us, to help us. At their core, our nativity displays get it right: here is the Lord himself, coming to be near to the very people and creation He came to save. The manger reveals Jesus' humility, gentleness, love, and readiness to help. Isn't this exactly the Savior we need to meet with in prayer?

You may have a nativity display in your home or see one at church or as you drive around the community. I invite you to allow those displays serve as tangible reminders to pray. Here is Jesus, come to be near to us. Let us draw near to Him!

In him and through faith in him we may approach God with freedom and confidence. Eph. 3:12

Let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings. Heb. 10:22
