

COOKS IN THE BELFRY

(How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth! Psalm 119:103 NIV)

Resurrection Rolls

Using visual aids is a wonderful way to teach children, especially an object lesson that can be eaten after. Consider making these Resurrection Rolls WITH your family and explaining how the different steps represent the story of Jesus' death and resurrection. For example:

- Rolling the marshmallow in the cinnamon and sugar is like when Jesus' friends prepared his body for burial with fragrant spices.
- Wrapping the dough around the marshmallow is like wrapping Jesus' body in linens.
- Since Jesus was inside the tomb for 3 days let the children sit in front of the oven and watch them bake. You can talk about how His friends and family must have felt and share your feelings as well.
- As the rolls are cooling, read the account given in Matthew 28:1-6. You can also find the account written in John chapter 20.
- Allow the children to eat the Resurrection Rolls and see that the center is empty just like the tomb.



Refrigerated crescent dinner rolls Large (jumbo) marshmallows Unsalted butter Cinnamon - you can also add nutmeg Granulated sugar

Directions:

PREP. Preheat the oven to 350°F. Line a baking sheet with parchment or silicone liner. Open the crescent roll package and separate the rolls into eight triangles.

- 1. COAT. In a small bowl, whisk together the cinnamon and sugar. Dip each of the marshmallows in the melted butter, then roll in the cinnamon sugar mixture.
- 2. FILL. Place a marshmallow in the middle of each dough triangle, then roll the dough tightly around the marshmallow, pinching to close all of the seams. Be very careful to seal the edges of the rolls, as the marshmallows will ooze out while they bake.
- 3. BAKE. Place the rolls on the prepared baking sheet. Bake for 10-14 minutes, or until golden brown.

FOOD PANTRY NEWS

The food pantry served 106 families in the month of January and 71 so far in February and there is still another week to go. Each week more and more families are coming to receive help. Food insecurity is becoming more prevalent in Greene County. On Friday, February 23rd, a trip will be made to Catholic Charities in Terre Haute to get around 968 pounds or more of USDA food items. These are free of charge but boughten items like eggs, hamburger, egg noodles, peanut butter and corn muffin mix will be picked up at that time also. Weekly food items from CVS, Dollar General, Rulers help greatly and the monthly donation from Walmart helps tremendously. The local churches have continued to donate food items or monetarily: First Baptist, First Christian, Bloomfield Methodist, Mineral Methodist, Presbyterian, Holy Name Catholic Church and Mansions In Heaven. Donations from several individuals have helped to keep the shelves stocked. The Bloomfield 4th grade class and the LightHouse Custom meats donated several canned goods, ham slices, hams, frozen fruit, hot dog buns and some small frozen turkeys. Two trips have been made to the Crane Commissary where all types of food items were donated. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!!!

BLESSING BOX UPDATE

This ministry continues to serve many in our community with items that are not available in our Food Pantry. Cleaning supplies, paper goods, deodorant, shampoo, combs, brushes, bandaids, and feminine products are needed. Donations from outside are occasionally left in the box, but our church family is our biggest supporter. Thank you for your prayers and dedication to this ministry.

4TH-6TH GRADE SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS

The 4th through 6th grade Sunday School Class spent the last six weeks identifying and studying some "Star Words". The lessons in this series helped us understand the concepts of Sin, Love, Grace, Forgiveness, Belief, and Faithfulness, six of the most important words in any galaxy. The lessons we studied give us A True Hope. The memory verse was from John 1:4-5: "In Him was life and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."

Each lesson began with a skit that was performed by the Youth Sunday School Class. The skit, the Galactic Republic's favorite drama, "As the Lightsaber Burns", involved five characters: Only One Cannoli, Dirk Skyrunner, Dave Solo, Rando Corinthians, and Dork Vader. Those playing the skit characters were: Oliver Foxworthy, Brady Hughes, Avery Malone, Casey Porter and Jeffrie Porter. (Thank you to the Youth and Pastor Nathan for their assistance!)

From the skits, the 4th-6th grade class was tasked with identifying the Star Word. We studied the word based on a lesson designed around a scripture reading. Here's what we learned from each Star Word:

Sin: Sin is disobeying God and not doing what he says is right.

Love: Nothing is more powerful than love.

Grace: Grace means being forgiven when we don't deserve it.
Forgiveness: When God forgives, He takes our sins away forever.
Belief: Belief means trusting what the Bible says is true.
Faithfulness: Faithfulness means following God's way every day.

If you haven't guessed it, the lesson series used the Star Wars story as its basis for the lessons. You may think it is a little "far-fetched", but we all know that the core of Star Wars is a battle between good and evil. People have always known that there is good and evil in the world, and they know one is much more desirable than the other. SIN entered the world and has been part of the human struggle ever since. We needed God's LOVE to save us from our sins, so He sent His Son Jesus. The giving of His Son provided us with much needed GRACE. Jesus offers us FORGIVENESS for our sins through that grace. The Bible tells us God raised Jesus to life again. If we believe that, Jesus promises to save us from sin and give us eternal life. BELIEF means we trust that what the Bible says is true. In the end, each of us must choose: will we follow the dark path of sin and shame, or will we choose FAITHFULNESS to Jesus and follow the Light? May the force of God's powerful love be with you. Choose the Light!

FROM THE MODERAOR

The Church Council met on February 8, 2024. John Bailey gave a brief demonstration on the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED). An AED is a medical device designed to analyze the heart rhythm and deliver an electric shock to victims of ventricular fibrillation to restore the heart rhythm to normal. There are two AEDs located at FBC.

Bob Weeks gave an update from the Discovery Group and presented a list of suggested uses for the CLC.

Committee reports followed.

Church Scholarships were discussed, the deadline for submitting applications being 1 April.

The following items were discussed and approved concerning the eclipse weekend:

- To provide and serve chicken & noodles: Saturday lunch and dinner in the Bloomfield Park at the North Shelter House and Sunday dinner in the CLC. The money raised from the sale of the chicken & noodles will go to cover the cost of the Saturday evening concert, and the leftover money will be designated to the General Fund.
- To host a Sunday evening concert at 7 pm in the church sanctuary featuring Jason Gray
- To allow the Boy Scouts the use of the shelter house on Monday to sell food
- To designate doormen at the CLC and Church Narthex to allow people to access restroom facilities and in the case of inclement weather
- To provide a respite station for First Responders on Monday, 8 April
- To have someone directing traffic and to assist in parking

A NOTE FROM PASTOR NATHAN

"Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing."

1 Peter 3:9 (N/V)



Sometimes, people do things that anger, disappoint, or hurt me. Naturally, I begin to think negative thoughts. Maybe you do this, too.

Negative thoughts run the spectrum. Some are legitimate – what a person or people did or said was actually wrong. It is appropriate for me to name this. I might be genuinely hurting or grieving because of what happened. That, too, is valid. But some of my thoughts are sinful, bitter, resentful, or vindictive. These are the dangerous ones.

There are healthy ways to deal with negative thoughts and feelings, both the "good" ones and the "bad" ones. I might have a quiet time in the presence of the Lord. I might seek out someone who cares, who will listen empathetically, help me process the situation, and pray with me. In the context of a safe and loving relationship, I could even talk directly to the person who hurt me, so that we can together pursue understanding, forgiveness, and reconciliation.

But there are also destructive ways to deal with my negative thoughts and feelings. Instead of seeking out a listening ear to share about what has happened, I might move into the realm of gossip, slander, or malice, trying to get my listener to join with me in my condemnation of the one(s) who hurt me. Or, rather than speaking to the person who wronged me in love, I might angrily lash out, making mean, sarcastic, or demeaning comments, severing the relationship even further.

When we do these things, we misrepresent the cross of Christ. "Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with blessing." Jesus responded to the ultimate evil, the ultimate insult – the cross – with blessing. He was and is the Holy One, murdered by the very people He loves and came to save. There has never been a greater wrong in all of history.

His response? Blessing. "Father, forgive them, for the do not know what they are doing."

This is not my instinctive response when I am wronged, wounded, or angered! My flesh cries for condemnation, but Christ calls out for forgiveness. The Holy Spirit convicts me, challenges me, and invites me to a better way. If the Spirit of the forgiving King is alive in me, then even when I am wronged, I have calling and the power to forgive. So do you.

Not all forgiveness situations are created equal. A person who has built up all kinds of benefit of the doubt in our eyes may have wronged us once in a comparatively small matter. In such cases, it may seem relatively easy for us to forgive.

On the other hand, we are sometimes wronged deeply and repeatedly, even by the very people in our lives whom we were supposed to be able to trust fully. Forgiveness in these cases, and in many cases, can prove to be a lengthy journey.

Forgiveness is a decision – often a series of decisions – to join with Jesus on a journey. I find that life and my own heart automatically provide a series of diversions and hurdles along the way. But there stands Jesus, hand outstretched, eyes beckoning, inviting me to get back on the path to forgiveness again. This may be hard, but it's the only way to healing.

The thing is, having walked the path of bitterness, I find no satisfaction at the end. Never. The path of forgiveness offers peace and a surprising lightness, even joy. It is harder won, to be sure; not without tears, but abundantly worthwhile.


The next time we are angered, may our eyes turn to the cross, which proclaims the undeserved forgiveness that God has offered to you and to me. Jesus himself has received our wounds on our behalf and in advance. May His cross compel us and release us to rise up, join Him, and rely on Him for the sometimes painful but always worthwhile journey of grace.

Let us not repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with blessing. To this we are called. Holy Spirit, help us!


