In 1975 the church suffered a second fire that damaged their sanctuary. Another fire in 2005 completely destroyed the interior of their church. In 2010, they moved into the first floor of their new building. They are reaching out to their diverse community by serving sit down meals and delivering food to hungry people. Despite the tragedies in their own church, they are being the hands and feet of Jesus to their community.

Many times, these children leave home without any of their possessions. We can help them on that first scary night with some security, comfort, and knowledge that someone cares. 

Summer Camp at Indian Creek



The First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain

The Food Justice Program of the First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain, operated through our non-profit The Centre for Faith, Art & Justice is a vital community ministry serving thousands of our neighbors who face



food insecurity. An effort that began as small sit-down meals on Wednesday and Saturday grew exponentially during COVID to serve 700 meals and provide groceries for over 340 households a week. And, most amazingly, this food was delivered to recipients' homes by hundreds of volunteers.

The Greater Boston Food Bank estimates that 1.6 million citizens of Massachusetts do not get enough to eat. While some aspects of the pandemic have subsided, food insecurity is not one of them. With little publicity we have a waiting list of 100 households and there are people still signing up.

We focus on serving individuals who are historically marginalized populations disproportionately impacted by food insecurity and unhealthy diets, including low-income families, seniors, and members of the Latinx community. Our goal is to collaborate with partners across our city and state to provide as many people as possible with access to healthy food because we believe that good food heals.

Funds received from grants provided by America for Christ will allow us to sustain the work of distributing healthy food to our neighbors. Please give today!
