This month's recipes come from our 125th Anniversary Cookbook.

COOKS IN THE BELFRY

Fresh Spinach Salad

1 lb. fresh spinach 3 or 4 green onions

Croutons: 2 to 3 Tbsp. butter 3 or 4 slices crisp bacon

1 1/2 c. bread cubes

Melt butter in skillet. Saute bread cubes until hard and toasted nicely.

Dressing: 1 egg1 clove garlic, minced 1/2 c. salad oil 1/2 c. Parmesan cheese

1/8 to 1/4 tsp. red pepper 1/2 tsp. salt about 5 tsp. white vinegar

Combine egg and garlic on medium speed of electric mixer. Add oil a little at a time; beat until thick. Blend in rest of ingredients and refrigerate. Combine mixture, dressing and croutons just before serving.

Mandarin Orange Salad

1 head lettuce 1 small can mandarin oranges, drained 1 (Goz.) pkg. walnuts, sauteed 1 can onion rings

Mix together and add celery seed dressing just before serving.

Celery Seed Dressing: 1/2 c. oil $\frac{1}{2}$ c. onion 1/2 tsp. salt

4 Tbs. sugar

1/2 tsp. dry mustard



Mix well in blender. After well blended, add: 1/4 c. cider vinegar

1 1/2 tsp. celery seed

Dressing is better if made the day before serving and stored in refrigerator.


FOOD PANTRY NEWS

A special council meeting was held at 6:30pm on Tuesday March 12th to discuss developing a safety/security plan in the event of oncoming severe weather or a potential security risk while attending service at FBC. A NOTE FROM PASTOR NATHAN



Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up. He said: *"In a certain town there was a judge who neither feared God nor cared about men. And there was a widow in that town who kept coming to him with the plea, 'Grant me justice against my adversary.' "For some time"*

he refused. But finally he said to himself, 'Even though I don't fear God or care about men, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will see that she gets justice, so that she won't eventually wear me out with her coming!" And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night? Will he keep putting them off? I tell you, he will see that they get justice, and quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?"

Luke 18:1-8, N/V'84

Sometimes, we get tired of praying. When we encounter difficult relationships or circumstances, it can be easier to see our challenges than our God. Things change slowly. Situations seem impossible. We grow weary of praying. We give up.

Jesus knows this, so He tells a parable about prayer. There are three characters in this story: a judge, a widow, and her adversary. The widow is almost certainly vulnerable, and her adversary, by implication, is almost certainly wealthy (and apparently, in the wrong).

The judge cares nothing of this. He has no regard for God and no particular interest in helping people. This judge is in it for himself. Why should he care about some poor, wronged widow? More important things, please.

But she won't let the matter drop! She wears him out! He can't take it anymore! "I *don't* care about God," he says to himself, "and I *certainly* don't care about people. But *this* lady is going to kill me!" (My paraphrase.)

Therefore, he sees to it that the widow gets justice in the dispute with her adversary. He doesn't pursue justice because he fears God or because he cares about poor widows, but because he is sick and tired of her persistence.

Contrast this judge with God, who not only cares about justice but defines what justice is. God loves all people, including poor widows (and adversaries and judges). God has no reluctance to overcome. He is eager to intervene on behalf of the needy. He will see to it that the widow gets justice, and "quickly."

But, she might have to wait for it.

The very fact that Jesus calls His disciples to *persistent* prayer indicates that "quickly" doesn't always mean "now" or even "soon." Persistent prayer is necessary because the outcomes we seek are often delayed.

There is a strange paradox here. From God's end, there is no reluctance to intervening on behalf of His people. God loves us and desires justice for us and is abundantly able to bring it about. Yet, even when the faithful pray, we experience delays in the (desired) answers to those prayers. If God is just and God cares about us, why must we wait?

That's a great question. Jesus ends this conversation with another great question: "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?" Faith operates on the basis of unseen realities. The faithful are commended for living by faith *even while not yet receiving the promised things they were waiting for* (Heb. 11:39).


Faith responds well while waiting. Faith waits confidently, knowing that God will graciously intervene. But faith waits.

Books could be written about why we don't always experience results to our prayers right away. But isn't because God doesn't care or because God isn't able to intervene. He will prove faithful to all of His promises for all of His people.

But, when the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on the earth?

Let us pray!
