INSTRUCTIONS FOR THOSE SEEKING HEALING:

- Ask the Lord to help you examine your heart and your relationship with Him. If
 the Holy Spirit brings something to mind that requires repentance and
 forgiveness, address this need before asking for healing. As far as you are able,
 make sure that your heart is clear before God.
- Take a green card from one of the tables or your bulletin and put on it your first name and the one thing for which you are asking. Your need will be kept confidential unless you circle "no" on the card.
- Approach one of the prayers for anointing and prayer. Come humbly, yet with confidence that Christ can heal. You may kneel or sit as is comfortable for you.
- If you are unable to come forward, raise your hand and we will come to you.
- Visualize yourself in the presence of Christ, for He is present with you. Reach out to Him in heart and spirit believe in His ability to heal.
- After your anointing, give thanks to God for hearing your prayers, and express
 your confidence in Him and in His timing in all things.
- Arise in faith and return to your seat to reflect upon the Lord's love for you and what you have just experienced and join in with the prayers of the congregation for other seekers.


INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE CONGREGATION:
