A Note from Pastor Nathan

Last week's sermon addressed the exploits of Ehud, the crafty left-hander in Judges 3. The right man was on Israel's side, and one little "word" from God felled the imposing king who had oppressed them for 18 years. Our closing hymn was "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," by Martin Luther. I have found it helpful as a devotional practice to meditate on hymns and songs like this one. Try committing a line or verse to memory. We are reminded that we have a Deliverer who surpasses Ehud in all ways, and who has brought about true and enduring "shalom" for God's people. I invite you to spend some time just soaking in these truths. The right Man is on our side. We will not fear for God has willed his truth to triumph through us. His Kingdom is forever!

(By the way, "Lord Sabaoth" means, "Lord of Hosts," referring to the heavenly armies of angels.)

You might also try this with other hymns or worship songs. It might become a fresh avenue for you to draw closer to God.
