### A NOTE FROM PASTOR NATHAN

And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people. Ephesians 6:18 (N/V)

We spent much of 2023 on a journey through Paul's letter to the Ephesians. One of the dominant themes of the letter is prayer. I asked our deacons to each identify a scripture passage to pray over our congregation in 2024. On Sunday, January 7, we will have a special service of prayer for our church. Below are themes and scriptures we will highlight.

- For abounding love and discernment, Philippians 1:9-11
- That God would renew our minds, Romans 12:2
- For purity and that we would faithfully minister to those in need, James 1:27
- That we would encourage one another, Hebrews 10:24-25
- For continual awareness of God's goodness, Psalm 34:8
- For continual experience of Christ's peace and joy, Philippians 4:4-9
- For confident, faithful perseverance, 1 Peter 5:10

We ultimately landed on a list of seven scriptures, which conveniently fit with the days of the week. You are invited to take the above list (which will also appear in the first bulletin of the year) and post it in some prominent place – the refrigerator door, the bathroom mirror, as a bookmark in your Bible, or somewhere else you'll see it daily – and pray for our church family in a different specific way each day of the week. On Sunday, we can pray for love and discernment. On Monday, for the renewal of our minds. And so on. I'm excited to see what the Holy Spirit will do in response to our intentional, specific, and unified prayer for our church body.

As a bonus, consider this an opportunity for scripture memory! You might not look up the scripture passage for each theme every single time that you pray, but as often as you are able, I encourage you to do so. Repetition leads to familiarity which leads to memorization. "Letting the word of Christ dwell in us richly" is so beneficial for our pursuit of Jesus. Give it a try!

Prayer, scripture reading, and memorization aren't just "things to do." We deliberately engage these practices because they are formative. The Holy Spirit shapes us to look more like Jesus as we pursue these things together. Please join with me in pursuing the Lord through the word and in prayer in 2024.
