Peanut Butter Chocolate Chip Energy Bites

1 cup old-fashioned oats 1/4 cup pure maple syrup

1/4 teaspoon kosher salt

1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1/4 cup dark chocolate chips

1/2 cup creamy peanut butter

Place oats, peanut butter, maple syrup, vanilla, and salt in a food processor and pulse until combined, about 10 pulses. Scrape down the sides of the bowl. Add chocolate chips and pulse a few times to coarsely chop.

Taking small spoonfuls of the mixture at a time, use your hands to form it into 1-inch balls. I find that using both the palm of my hand and fingertips to squeeze the mixture together works best to shape the balls.



Store in the refrigerator.

Spaghetti or Pizza Sauce

Taken from the First Baptist 125th Anniversary Cookbook

1 1/2 gal. tomato juice

3 lb. onions (6 c. after blended)

2 green mangoes

1 hot pepper or 1/2 tsp. red pepper

48 oz. tomato paste

6 bay leaves

2 cloves or 1/2 tsp. garlic powder

1 pt. salad oil

1 c. (more or less) sugar

1/2 c. salt

2 Tbsp. each oregano, basil, and parsley

Blend onions and mangoes in blender and drain. Cook juice, onions, mangoes, and hot pepper for 1 hour. Add rest of ingredients and cook for 1 more hour. Put in jars and seal. Cold pack for 20 minutes or pressure for 5 minutes at 10 pounds of pressure. Wakes 7 quarts. (Watch for boil over)

FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

The Bloomfield 3rd grade donated 255 pounds of food items. The Crane Commissary has started donating to the pantry also. Pickups might be twice a month. Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow!!!!

A NOTE FROM PASTOR NATHAN



So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow.

1 Corinthians 3:17 (N/V)

I have a complicated relationship with the Baltimore Orioles. Not the baseball team, but the birds. All of them. That's an estimated global population of twelve million. Zero of them are in our yard.

It's not as though we *never* see them. In fact, as of this writing, we have seen two orioles in our yard this spring. They have made exceedingly brief appearances – one bird each on two separate days – at our hummingbird feeder.

The oranges and nectar I've set out for the orioles themselves? Untouched. Except by the hummingbirds. Complicated.

I've been hearing orioles nearly every day for two weeks around the neighborhood. The nifty bird identification app² on my phone confirms that I am indeed hearing Baltimore Orioles.

Hearing them, but not seeing them. At least not in our yard.

There are many birds we never see in our yard. Bald eagles, for example, are unlikely to visit our yard unless we install a large lake stocked with fish. They soar overhead, but they never land here. But, I don't *expect* them to do so.

Every other bird that we have sought to attract visits predictably. Even birds that are only passing through our area during migration are faithful to drop by, if only for several days.

We have an unspoken agreement. We put out the food the birds like, and the birds come. Easy, right? The bird books even say that if I just do a certain set of things, orioles will be *easily* attracted.

I am doing what appear to be all of the right things, but the desired results are tantalizingly beyond my control.

But maybe it's not about me. Maybe I don't have control over the outcomes of life. Maybe every bird is a gift from God, and I am only participating in the feeding process. He creates. He sends. He feeds. I just participate.

Maybe the Lord wants me to see this dynamic at work in the rest of life, in ministry, in circumstances, in relationships.

Paul was quite clear on this point. He had experienced all kinds of fruit in his ministry. People were coming to faith in Christ. New churches were planting and growing. Disciples he taught were going out and making more disciples. He healed people in Jesus' name. "Wow, what a guy!" Many who knew him thought so.

But not Paul. "By the grace of God, I am what I am" (1 Cor. 15:10). He labored, but with Christ's energy, powerfully working in him (Col. 1:28-29). "I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God's grace given me through the working of his power" (Eph. 3:7).

From this, it quite naturally flows that nobody in the garden really gets to take credit for the fruit. It was God working all along. It was Paul's role – it is our role – to be faithful.

There is such relief in this. It doesn't depend upon me! But there is humility in this as well. It wasn't because of me. This is good news for a healing service, for life, for ministry. Our role is to be faithful, humble servants. The results are God's.


May the Holy Spirit help me, and help us, to faithfully serve the Lord Jesus, contentedly, and leave all the results to Him.
