The Church's One Foundation By Samuel J. Stone




The Church's one foundation is Jesus Christ, her Lord;

COOKS IN THE BELFRY

(How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth! Psalm 119:103 NIV)

Cicada Stir Fry

1 onion minced

2 T. fresh coriander (cilantro), chopped

1 T. fresh ginger, minced

34 c. sliced carrots

34 c. chopped cauliflower and/or broccoli

1 can water chestnuts

34 c. bean sprouts

34 C. SNOW PEAS

1 lb. carrots, peeled

40 blanched newly hatched (teneral) cicadas

Directions:

- Capture cicadas at night as they emerge from the ground.
- Blanche for 1 minute in boiling water. They can now be stored in the freezer or used immediately in recipes.
- In a wok or other suitable pan, heat a couple tablespoons of vegetable oil. Add ingredients in the order listed above when those in the most recent addition are partially cooked.
- Serve over whole-grain rice and add soy sauce to taste.



Yield: 4 main course servings

Ms. Paula's Chocolate No Bake Cookies

Recipe taken from the FBC 125th Anniversary Cookbook submitted by Paula Bartlett.

2 c. white sugar

1/2 c. milk

1 stick margarine

Boil together 2 minutes. Remove from heat and add immediately:

1/2 c. peanut butter

Pinch of salt

6 or 7 T. cocoa 3 c. quick oats

1 tsp vanilla

Mix together well and drop by spoonfuls on waxed paper. Top each cookie with a whole pecan (optional).

FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

There were 90 families served in the month of May and 69 so far in the month of June. Some families have as many as 9, 12 or 13 in the household. Thank you to the members of Bloomfield First Baptist Church who gave spaghetti and spaghetti sauce to the pantry. The shelf looks much better now. Donations continue to come from Linton Walmart the first two Mondays of the month, Rulers in Bloomfield each Monday of the month, each Friday of the month the Crane Commissary, Bloomfield CVS, Bloomfield Dollar General, private individuals, Holy Name Catholic Church, Bloomfield Methodist Church, Mansions In Heaven Church, Bloomfield Christian Church and the Bloomfield Presbyterian Church. Monetary donations came from the Mineral Methodist Church, several individuals and organizations. FROM THE BLESSING BOX MINISTRY





A NOTE FROM PASTOR NATHAN

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this.

Isaiah 9:6-7 (N/V)

Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire.

Hebrews 12:28-29 (NIV)

This month, we celebrate the 248th birthday of the United States of America. I consider it a great privilege to be a citizen of this country and I am grateful for those who have made its continued existence possible. I enjoy cookouts, baseball games, apple pie, and the music of John Philip Sousa. I'm not a particular fan of fireworks or parades, but on the whole, Independence Day is a celebration I embrace. For all of its faults, both past and present, the United States remains a great place to be, and I am extremely thankful to live here.

You may, however, have some concerns about the present state of our country. I am not trying to be like Eeyore or Robert Barone here. Some things in the United States are in fact much better than they used to be. Without trying to cultivate a sense of despair, I simply acknowledge the potential for discouragement regarding our nation, for one reason or another. Sometimes, I feel that discouragement myself. How might we respond?

We remember that our ultimate and enduring citizenship is in the Kingdom of God. Being a citizen of the United States provides exceptional privileges and opportunities, but our citizenship in this temporary nation is itself temporary.

Only one kingdom endures forever. Jesus Christ is the head of that kingdom, as described in the Isaiah text above. Of the increase of His government and peace there shall be no end. This means, of course, that all other governments of all kinds will either surrender to His lordship or cease to exist. This includes the governance of myself: "If anyone would come after me, you must deny yourself and take up your cross daily and follow me." The universe has one true and rightful Lord, and everyone and everything will eventually be sorted on the basis of our response to that Lord.

Those of us who are responding positively to that Lord by faith are assured that we belong to His unshakable kingdom, which endures forever and brings comprehensive peace to all creation. Nations will no longer train for war. Unlikely characters and creatures will live in harmony. Isaiah persistently proclaims this hope. Revelation reveals heaven coming down and all things being made new. Peter envisions a new creation where righteousness is at home. The Lord's prayer is answered: His kingdom comes, and His will is done, fully, finally, and forever.


This entire enterprise rests squarely on the shoulders of King Jesus, who with His blood has purchased a people for God from every tribe and language and ethnic group and nation. He is remaking us to be His image-bearers, new creations whose lives point forward to the final and glorious reality of New Creation.

The Holy Spirit empowers us to live as instruments of King Jesus, working for His purposes, loving others with His love. This kind of witness cannot be defeated by any earthly political or social structures. Yet this kind of witness is needed in the midst of every political and social structure. We are Christ's ambassadors. The King makes His appeal through us.

When ballots offer us choices between people who hardly reflect the likeness of King Jesus but want us to put the government on their shoulders anyway, we remember that King Jesus and His government are not subject to election. We are free to keep on serving our King, confident that all of His platform will be finally implemented, and grateful that He has chosen to begin that implementation through us. *Therefore, since we are receiving a Kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and worship God acceptably with reverence and awe.* Holy Spirit, help us!


