



COOKS IN THE BELFRY

(How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth! Psalm 119:103 NIV)

This month features Donna Miller's apple pie recipe submitted by Brenda Flanagin. Donna likes to make up the pies "ready to bake" and put them in the freezer. This is typically a family event. She bakes them frozen for one hour at 350 degrees. So good!



6 cups apples (peeled/thinly sliced)

2 Tbsp flour 1 tsp cinnamon Dash of nutmeg 2 Tbsp butter Dash of salt 3/4 cup sugar

Combine sugar, flour, spices, salt. Mix with apples. Line 9 inch pie plate with pie crust. Fill with apple mixture; dot with butter. Cover with pie crust, cutting slits in the top. Sprinkle with sugar. Bake at 400 degrees for 50 minutes or until done.

FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

The food pantry served 80 families in the month of September, and there is still one more day to go. One day there were 6 families and 4 of them had 9,8 or 7 in the household. Needless to say, when there is that many in a household much food items are used, because there is more given to a larger family than a smaller family. A trip was made to Catholic Charities where 2270 pounds of USDA was picked up, and 1651 pounds of food was bought. This was on Wednesday, September 19th. Bloomfield Dollar General donated 1020.5, Bloomfield CVS donated 189 pounds, Rulers 64 pounds, Walmart 1624 pounds, and Crane Commissary 989 pounds. Area churches continue to donate many times a week, and that includes Bloomfield Baptist, Holy Name Catholic, Mansions In Heaven, First Christian and Bloomfield Methodist. The Lighthouse Meats donated 85 pounds of meat, and Rulers had a fund raiser for the pantry of donated peanut butter. Both were very much appreciated. Individuals who donated were Robin Henderson, Janet Skinner, Kathy England, Dennis and Karen Kutch, Sue's Produce, Tooger and Charlotte Smith, Joan Vaughn, Brad Ellis and Randall Brown. God bless all the workers from the pantry; from the ones who check the families in, those who pack the boxes and reshelve items, to those who drive to Walmart, Rulers, Crane and to Terre Haute to Catholic Charities!!! You all are appreciated so so much!!!!



A NOTE FROM PASTOR NATHAN

If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone.

Romans 12:18 (NIV)



The piano tuner just arrived.

"Bringing the world into harmony, one piano at a time," he quipped, only partly in jest, "that's my spiritual calling."

There's wisdom in that remark. A world that is out of harmony in so many ways desperately needs beautiful music. We need piano tuners, performers, manufacturers, composers, and a whole host of willing musicians to produce harmony.

I would not want to live in this world if there was no music.

Music, of course, hardly solves the world's problems. But music at its best whispers of a world to come – a world which we believe is coming, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Whenever we worship together, we are participating in a great heavenly scene in which the Creator is forever praised, and the Lamb is forever glorified (Rev. 4-5). One day, this scene is coming down to earth it its fullness, evil will be vanquished, and the world will be at harmony forever (Rev. 21-22).

The best music has often whispered of that world and stirred our hearts to long for it more deeply. Music is not magic, and some music isn't even very good, but you and I have both experienced music that has drawn us to something better.

The man in the sanctuary right now is doing his part, one piano at a time.

I should emphasize, *only* one piano at a time. I am not sure how many pianos he tunes in a week or even a year, but I am confident that it is only a small slice of the total number of pianos on the face of the earth. Many pianos are horribly out of tune and haven't been touched for years, drawing much more dust than any attention from nimble fingers.

So why does he bother? He only tunes pianos, and only a fraction of existing pianos. There are so many instruments he cannot touch, so many ensembles he cannot rehearse, so much music written or performed poorly. He has such little impact, it would seem, one man tuning one piano at a time.

Except that we've heard Andrew play the thing on Sundays. "That dude can flat play the piano," one of you said to me.

Truer words have never been spoken.

Think about how that blessing multiplies: every tuned piano is ready to be played again. The piano in our sanctuary has been played by so many pianists over the years, with many more voices singing along, with lives impacted in ways we probably cannot fully describe or understand. But we're all glad the piano tuners have kept coming back.

Now, to the verse at the top of the page. There is so much strife in our world. We are aware of violence in the Middle East, hatred on both sides of the aisle in Washington, natural disasters ravaging the planet, and conflict in our own community. In a bewildering number of ways, our world is reeling from a lack of genuine peace.

Neither you nor I can bring peace to the entire world. But we have peace with God, through Jesus Christ our Lord (Rom. 5:1). His Spirit is alive within us, producing the fruit of peace, even in the context of hardship (Gal. 5:22-23; Heb. 12:11). Jesus calls us to embody that peace in radically otherworldly ways (Lk. 6:27-28). Blessed are the peacemakers (Mt. 5:9).


Peacemakers are like piano tuners. We cannot harmonize the whole world's dysfunction, but we can facilitate the beautiful music of the Prince of Peace, one day, one place, one opportunity at a time. The more peacemakers we have, the better the world will be. *Holy Spirit, help us to be the salt, the light, the aroma of Christ, in a world longing for peace.*


