



# Chocolate Chip Pie Submitted by Nancy Cummings

2 eggs ½ c. flour ½ c. sugar

1/2 c. brown sugar

1 c. butter, melted and cooled 1 (6 oz.) pkg. chocolate chips 1 c. walnuts, chopped Cool Whip Topping

Beat eggs and add sugars and flour. Blend in melted butter. Stir in nuts and chips. Pour into unbaked pie shell. Bake at 325 degrees for 1 hour.

# Lemon Meringue Pie Submitted by Paula Bartlett

1 c. sour cream

3 slightly beaten egg yolks

1 (4 ½ oz.) pkg. Vanilla pudding mix

1 /4 c. milk

1/3 c. frozen lemonade concentrate, thawed

1 baked 9-inch pastry shell

3 egg whites

1/2 tsp. vanilla

1/4 tsp. cream of tartar

6 Tbsp. sugar

In saucepan, combine sour cream and egg yolks. Stir in pudding mix, milk, and lemonade concentrate. Cook and stir until mixture thickens and bubbles. Remove from heat, spoon into pastry shell.

Beat egg whites, vanilla, and cream of tartar until soft peaks form. Gradually add sugar, beating until stiff peaks form. Spread onto top of hot filling, sealing to edges of pastry. Bake at 350 degrees for 12 to 15 minutes. Cool. Chill before serving

#### 2025 FBC ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING NOTICE

To be eligible to vote, you must be a member of FBC and at least 16 years of age. The following is the agenda for the meeting:

- 1. Vote to approve minutes of the previous congregational meeting
- 2. Committee reports (no vote required)
- 3. Vote to approve the slate of FBC officers for 2025 (Closed ballot)
- 4. Vote to approve the proposed amount designated non-taxable for the FBC parsonage
- 5. Vote on FBC proposed security measures
- 6. 2025 FBC Budget (closed ballot)


\*FBC Secretary (Heather) has sent out the proposed budget via email and copies are available on the church library counter.



# A NOTE FROM PASTOR NATHAN

I remember my affliction and my wandering, the bitterness and the gall.

I well remember them, and my soul is downcast within me.

Yet this I call to mind and therefore I have hope:

Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail.

They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.

I say to myself, "The Lord is my portion; therefore I will wait for him."

The Lord is good to those whose hope is in him, to the one who seeks him; it is good to wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord.

Lamentation 3:19-26 (NIV)

One of our great Thanksgiving hymns is *Great Is Thy Faithfulness*. Both the title and the line, "Morning by morning new mercies I see," come from Lamentations 3.

Lamentations is not a happy book. Jerusalem had recently been violently destroyed by the Babylonians. Horrible suffering had transpired. Numerous people had died from war, disease, or starvation. Multiple rounds of exile had occurred, taking much of the population far from home. The temple was gone. The city was in shambles. Both those taken away and those left behind had experienced tremendous anguish. Their world had been turned upside down.

Yet the author of Lamentations is determined to see a hope and a future. His basis for confidence is in *who God is*. His love never ceases, and His mercies are fresh every morning. Any number of circumstances might change, and possibly for the worse, but God's loyal love remains steadfast, and His mercies are our daily experience.

Therefore, for the people to whom the Lord belongs – "the Lord is my portion," says our author – the final verdict will not be destruction but salvation. The Bible is full of promises that no matter how severe our trials may become, up to and including death itself, those who belong to God by faith will ultimately experience His life and salvation.

As I write this, I don't know what sadness may be upon your heart. At any given point in time, we as a congregation are facing a spectrum of difficulties. Sometimes, life is hard. Sometimes, church is hard.

We are invited to respond as Lamentations does, both by deliberately naming the things that have brought us anguish and by intentionally remembering that God's love and mercy have not – and will not – change.

This is why we sing songs like "Great Is Thy Faithfulness." This is why we read Psalms like #136 and add our own experiences to the list of reasons to "give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, his love endures forever." This is why we take a timeout to go walk in the woods or sit on the porch quietly with our Bibles to spend time in God's presence. This is why we gather around a table with family and friends for the deliberate purpose of giving thanks.

Life automatically provides many reminders of sorrow and grief. We are invited to intentionally pause from the rush of life to remember that God's love never fails, and God's mercies are fresh today, no matter what today may hold.




