# Henry Wadsworth Longfellow

The text for this hymn is based off of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's 1863 poem, "Christmas Bells." The poem itself was inspired by several painful events in Longfellow's life. For one, his son, Charles, joined the Union army without telling Henry before he left. Eventually, Charles was severely wounded in battle. Around the same time, Longfellow's wife, Frances, tragically died from an accidental fire, which left Henry badly burned as well. Longfellow wrote his poem on Christmas Day, telling of the despair in his heart as he heard the Christmas bells play. Fortunately, this poem ends on an encouraging note, emphasizing hope and peace among men, despite the troubles of the world.

# COOKS IN THE BELFRY

(How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth! Psalm 119:103 NIV)

Macaroni & Cheese 1 Pound elbow macaroni 4 oz (or more) cubed Velveeta Cheese Milk

Directions: Cook macaroni until the water is all gone. Add cheese cubes, stir until melted. Add milk if it needs more liquid. Bake in oven at 350° until brown on top. If you are in a hurry, you can skip baking in the oven.





Chocolate Chip Banana Bread

Mix together: 1/2 c. margarine, softened

34 c. sugar 2 eggs

Add: 2 ripe bananas, mashed

Gradually add: 2 c. flour 1 tsp. salt

1 1 54. 50111

1/2 tsp. baking soda

Stir in: 34 c. semi-sweet chocolate chips

1/2 c. walnuts (optional)

Pour into greased 9x5x3 loaf pan. Bake at 350° for 60 to 70 minutes (reduce tie for smaller pans or about 18 minutes for muffins)

Rocky Road

Melt together in microwave safe bowl.

Stir occasionally, until melted:

2 Tbs. butter

12 oz semi-sweet chocolate chips

14 oz can sweetened condensed milk

Stir into chocolate mixture: 10 oz mini marshmallows 2 ½ c. salted dry roasted peanuts

Spread into 9x13 pan lined with wax paper. Chill until firm. Cut into squares. Freezes well.

## **OPERATION SHOE BOX SUCCESS**




## Children's Program: Backyard Kids Club

# A NOTE FROM PASTOR NATHAN

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. John 1:14 (NIV)



One of the most meaningful ministry opportunities I have is to lead funerals. It is a blessing to serve families who are going through difficult times and to share good news about God with those who are hurting.

At any given funeral, people are present who do not have a relationship with Jesus. I have no idea how many people or which ones, but while we're gathered at a gravesite I often think: *Some of these people don't know Jesus*.

There are also people at every funeral whom I do not know personally. We might never cross paths anywhere else. Many people fit in both categories – they don't know Jesus and I don't know them.

What about the people who don't know Jesus and might *never* develop a significant relationship with *anyone* who knows and loves Jesus?

There are people in Greene County who have no meaningful relationship with Jesus or with any followers of Jesus. If people who know Jesus aren't interacting with people who don't know Jesus, how will anyone come to know Jesus?

This calls for intentionality. We must prayerfully discern ways to personally and graciously enter into the lives of people we might not otherwise connect with, in order to love them with the love of God.

This is Christmas. God intentionally – and at great cost – enters into our lives graciously and personally, to demonstrate His love for us. *The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.* 

More literally, "he pitched his tent" among us. Where are we pitching our tents? How might we deliberately initiate relationships with people who do not know Jesus?

Are we willing to do this even if it is inconvenient or uncomfortable? The manger and the cross were uncomfortable.

I encourage you this Christmas season and in the year ahead to pray about this. Where do you and I have opportunities to deliberately collide with people who might not be Christians? How can we build relationships in these spaces?

I give an example, not to brag but to get the creativity flowing. For several years, I have tutored one student per semester, one hour per week, at Bloomfield High School. This has not resulted in radical academic transformation (although my math skills have been somewhat resurrected). My most recent student dropped out. I'm not sure that *any* of them graduated. I've only had post-high-school contact with one of these students. But each one has been deliberately loved and prayed for by someone who loves Jesus. I believe God produces fruit that I cannot yet see.

Among our church family, I am aware of tutors, substitute teachers, cafeteria workers, scout leaders, athletic coaches, CASA advocates, jail visitors, volunteers at community service organizations, and more. Additionally, any of us who have work responsibilities which put us in contact with others find ourselves, simply in the course of work, with opportunities to build relationships with people who might not have relationships with Jesus. How might we take advantage of this?

We need to pray as a congregation, too. We have many activities in our building to which the whole world is welcome, from Sunday morning services to Hoops for Him to White Christmas box distributions. We host other community groups for various events. But how are we, as a congregation, *going* into all the world?

I have no perfect answers. But the Holy Spirit is nudging us. Where can we go and pitch our tents? With whom can we build new relationships? How can we "be Christmas?" Let's pray about it! Let's talk about it! *Holy Spirit, help us!*
