Confession, adapted from Daniel 9:4-19, NIV

LEADER: O Lord, the great and awesome God, who keeps his covenant of love with all who love him and obey his commands, we have sinned and done wrong.

PEOPLE: We have been wicked and have rebelled; we have turned away from your commands and laws.

LEADER: Lord, you are righteous, but this day we are covered with shame...

PEOPLE: The Lord our God is merciful and forgiving, even though we have rebelled against him.

LEADER: O Lord, in keeping with all your righteous acts, turn away your anger and your wrath. Our sins and the iniquities of our fathers have made your people an object of scorn.

PEOPLE: Now, our God, hear the prayers and petitions of your servants.

LEADER: For your sake, O Lord, look with favor on your desolate sanctuary.

PEOPLE: Give ear, O God, and hear!

LEADER: We do not make requests of you because we are righteous, but because of your great mercy.

ALL: O Lord, listen! O Lord, forgive! O Lord, hear and act! For your sake, O my God, do not delay, because your people bear your Name.
