Required Background Checks



Create this colorful July 4th craft.

What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5"x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- Drinking straw

What you do:

- Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
- 2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
- 3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
- 4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
- 5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
- 6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!

Mission Moment

Bangladesh is designated as Hostile. 87% of Bangladeshis are Sunni Muslims and 2 percent

are Shia Muslims. Only one-half of 1 percent are Christians. Local Muslim authorities, Islamic Extremist groups, families, and communities persecute Christians. Hindu believers in the northwestern part of the country and Buddhist extremists persecute believers in the Chittagong Hill Tracts. While many Christian groups meet publicly, others worship in unregistered churches. Believers are sometimes forced to leave their homes and community.

The Bangladesh Bible Society and the missions community have made Bibles available in several languages. Those living in rural communities have difficulty getting and finding a Bible.

VOM serves those expelled from their communities and provides for medical needs of those who have been injured in persecution attacks.

Each day as you begin your Bible study and devotional time, please take time to remember those in persecuted countries who are taking a risk when they want to learn more about God.

Fuel the Mission - Feed the Need

The mission of the Bloomfield First Baptist Food Pantry is to assist food-insecure families in and around Greene County, Indiana by providing access to healthy and nutritious food.

The pantry serves between 80 and 100 families in Greene County each and every month. Households may visit the pantry once per month to receive a variety of healthy items including meat, milk, eggs, bread and other pantry staples. The quantity of food distributed is based on the number of individuals in the household.

The Food Pantry is open weekly on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m., and Wednesday evenings from 4:30 to 6:00 p.m. It is operated entirely by volunteers who are passionate about serving those experiencing food insecurity in our community.

Donations- whether monetary or in the form of food items- from individuals, churches, businesses, or organizations, are vital to our mission. Unfortunately, donations have recently declined.

We are currently seeking local businesses, groups, or individuals willing to partner with us-either through a one-time contribution or a sustaining commitment- to help us continue meeting the needs of our neighbors.

Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.

1 Corinthians 12:27 (N/V)

I had the privilege of spending four days at Indian Creek Baptist Camp in June. Tiffany and four other girls from our church were there for Girls' Camp. I had no official responsibilities – I wasn't the camp pastor or a cabin leader; I didn't lead any devotional time or worship service. I just told Jordan I was willing to help wherever needed.



Most of my time was spent renovating a cabin to get it ready for the following week, but I got to help the staff with a few other odds and ends as well. Jordan, Mindy, and their staff are doing a great job (that includes Kinley, Taylor, and Aiden!). When you send a child or grandchild to camp, you can rest assured it will be a safe and well-run experience.

What's fun about camp is, there are so many people involved in making it happen, carrying a variety of responsibilities, some of which the campers see, and many of which the campers never see. I spent a few days doing a little work on one cabin, which is easily much older than I am. Most of the girls who would stay in that cabin the following week have no idea who I am. How many others have worked on camp buildings over the years, from construction to cleaning to maintenance? Any given camper on any given week has not met most of those volunteers. But they have made an impact. They are still making an impact.

Most of the campers get to interact with most of the camp staff on any given week. Many campers will remember some of those staff members for years to come. But the campers only see a small part of what the staff do. The staff are preparing s'more fixings, lighting campfires, cooking meals, cleaning cabins, rehearsing worship songs, opening the pool, and doing all sorts of activities behind the scenes while the campers are busy doing something else. That's the way it's supposed to be. The kids just arrive at their next item on the schedule, and it's ready to go.

Most of those staff members, like me, went to church camp many years as a camper before serving on staff. Each of those camp experiences was supported by volunteers and staff and sending churches. They each benefited from contributions seen and unseen. There are some people who have not ever been able to go to camp, but they have prayed for camp, donated supplies to camp, given money to camp, or sent food to camp.

Camp is the body of Christ in action. There are a great many roles to fill, and it has taken so many people over a period of many years to set the stage for any given week of camp. Fruit is happening now from seeds sown years ago. Each person does what God has called him or her to do, and trusts that that role is but a small part of what the Holy Spirit will accomplish through the efforts of other brothers and sisters in Christ.

This is VBS month. VBS starts on Sunday evening, July 27. One of my favorite parts of that week annually is to see so many people from our church participate in so many ways. Some are hands-on with the kids; others have behind-the-scenes roles. The body of Christ comes together, and children are blessed in Jesus' name.




