



Special Congregational Meeting Sunday, February 8

Congregational Meeting

There will be a short Congregational Meeting held in conjunction with our Fellowship Breakfast on Sunday, February 8. The purpose of the meeting is in response to a notice the church received from our insurance carrier that our sexual misconduct claim coverage has been reduced, because we do not have an official Child Protection Plan in place. In an effort to get our coverage back to its original amount, and to ensure the safety and protection of the people, resources, and ministries God has entrusted to our care, a Child Protection Policy has been developed. The document has been revised and approved by Council and now seeks approval by the congregation to immediately take effect and be incorporated into our Personnel, Policies, and Procedures Handbook. The document was emailed to you on Friday, January 23. If you have not received it, please contact Heather and she will resend it to you. Thank you!



NOTE FROM NATHAN

"But I tell you who hear me: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you."
Luke 6:27-28, NIV

"You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; for your anger does not produce God's righteousness."
James 1:19-20, NRSV



As of this writing, I am impressed again by the sheer divisiveness and anger that is rampant in our country. You are familiar with the particular events and issues which are causing consternation. People are not simply polarized; we are outraged. The expression of anger seems to have become virtuous, whether or not our anger is actually righteous, and regardless of whether our anger is being expressed in constructive ways. We are, on the whole, a very angry people.

Here comes Valentine's Day, a holiday our culture associates with love. Love means a lot of things to a lot of people. What does it mean to us? *God demonstrates his love for us in this: while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us* (Rom. 5:8). *Love one another as I have loved you... by this all people will know you are my disciples* (John 13:34-35).

What is distinctive about a Christian? How we dress? What we look like? Where we live? What language we speak? How we vote? What we think about particular social issues? In all of these categories and more, we find great variety among Christians. The global body of Christ is a diverse group. Christianity in America is a diverse group. And that is okay! If we were all exactly the same and agreed on everything all of the time, "love one another" might not be quite so challenging.

But "love one another" is our command. And the Bible is full of commands that go with it, like the two I have selected above. To be human is to have enemies, and not all of them are lined up on the other side of the battlefield in uniform. All of us have people in our lives whom we are inclined to dislike. Some are neighbors or relatives. Others are on TV. Some have actually done things to us that have been hurtful. Others, we have only heard of, but they make us angry.

My encouragement to you – and this is a challenge for me, as well – is to stop the next time someone makes you angry, and pray for them. You might see a news story and find yourself outraged at what some individual said or what some group did. Take the opportunity to pray for that person, or for those people. Not the condescending prayer of the Pharisee – "Lord, I thank you I'm not like so and so" – but a prayer of blessing. Pray for the person's family, spouse, children. Pray that the Lord would bring joy and peace to that person's life. Pray for that person's forgiveness – and that the Lord would help you and me to forgive them as well.

Along with this, when someone expresses an opinion we don't like – what if our first inclination was to listen? If you share an idea that I disagree with, what if I was more interested in hearing you out, learning why you feel that way, and appreciating the nuance of your perspective? What if we were actually quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger?

As I'm writing this, I find these commands are a little bit daunting! Love and pray blessing for my enemies? Be quick to listen and slow to speak? These are *so hard* sometimes. *Very hard* sometimes.


And yet the Crucified Jesus is alive in us. The one who said, "Father, forgive them," and who lovingly died at the hands of His enemies. This Jesus, who has defeated death itself, and is alive forever, is also living in us by the Holy Spirit. If the Spirit of Him who gave us these commands is living in us, then we have the potential to actually live them out.

So, Holy Spirit, in this angry and divided world, help us to be a blessing. Help us to love and seek blessing for those who anger us most, and help us to be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to anger. Help us to love people well, that the love of Jesus might shine through us. Help us to stick with it when it's hard. And may You get all of the glory.
